

Slide 1: Product Vision – What Are You Building Towards?

Title:

Product Name <Earlier Project Name>

Include:

- Team Name
- Track Name
- Team Members
- One-line Product Vision Statement

Description:

Start with your vision, not just your product. This slide should clearly communicate what you are trying to build in the long run and the impact you aim to create. Go beyond “what it does” and explain what it can become. Think of it as a bold, forward-looking statement that tells the judges your ambition - clear, confident, and memorable.

Slide 2: Problem Statement – What Are You Solving?

Title:

The Problem

Include:

- Clear description of the problem
- Who is facing this problem?
- Why does it matter?

Description:

Explain the problem in a way that makes judges care. Avoid generic statements. Be specific, grounded, and real. A strong problem statement sets the stage for everything that follows.

Slide 3: Your Solution – What Have You Built?

Title:

Our Solution

Include:

- What your product does
- How it solves the problem
- Key idea behind your approach

Description:

This is your “aha” moment. Clearly connect your solution to the problem. The judge should instantly understand what your product is and why it exists.

Slide 4: Product Walkthrough – How It Works

Title:

How It Works

Include:

- Step-by-step user flow
- Screenshots or flow diagrams
- Key interactions

Description:

Walk the judge through your product as if they are the user. Keep it simple and visual. Show the journey from input to output.

Slide 5: Key Features – What Makes It Strong

Title:

Key Features

Include:

- 3–5 core features
- Brief explanation of each

Description:

Highlight what you've built - not everything, just what matters most. Focus on features that demonstrate strength, usability, and impact.

Slide 6: Architecture & Tech Stack – How You Built It

Title:

Architecture & Tech Stack

Include:

- System architecture diagram
- Technologies used (frontend, backend, APIs, AI services)
- Data flow (if applicable)

Description:

Show that your system is well-engineered, not just functional. Keep it clean and readable. Judges should see structure, not chaos.

Slide 7: AI Integration & Enhancements

Title:

AI Integration & Enhancements

Include:

- Where and how AI is used
- Why AI was used (purpose, not decoration)
- Enhancements made
- Highlight Mentor feedback incorporated, if any

Description:

This slide proves evolution. Show that you didn't just build—you refined, improved, and made smarter decisions.

Slide 8: Product - Scalability, Challenges & What's Next

Title:

Scalability & Future Scope

Include:

- Demonstrate that your product is Scalable
- What is the GTM?
- Current Challenges
- Future improvements / RoadMap

Description:

End with maturity. Acknowledge what's not perfect and show where this can go. This tells judges you're thinking like product builders, not just participants.
